## SHEA's Long-Term-Care Committee

Presently, an influenza position paper is the most advanced project of the committee. Initial work toward new position papers on TB and urinary tract infections in long-term-care facilities, as well as an update of papers dealing with antimicrobial use and resistance, will be undertaken through 1999.
