#### WHY GOVERNMENTS GROW

Measuring Public Sector Size

Governments are growing too large—and should be cut down to size. Many people would agree with this statement, but there is less likely to be agreement about why governments grow and how much government is beneficial. A clearer concept of what we are measuring is needed. In Why Governments Grow, an international assembly of authors addresses this empirical and theoretical challenge. Original studies focus on procedures for measuring the growth of government and interpretations of relevant data. They look at actors ranging from semi-government entities such as contractors and charities to local, state, and federal bureaucracies; at indicators of the scope of government including public revenues and expenditures, the services performed by government, the number of laws enacted, and the degree to which regulations are enforced.
