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The Conference on British Studies is the official organization in the United States and Canada of scholars working in the field of British history and culture; its status as such is recognized by the American Historical Association of which it is an affiliate. Its nearly eight hundred members are drawn from forty-eight states and five provinces. It convenes twice each year, usually at New York University.

The Conference awards a prize triennially for the best first book by an American or Canadian scholar.

The Conference sponsors a considerable publications program. It publishes the *Journal of British Studies* at Trinity College; the *British Studies Intelligencer*, a newsletter, at Kansas State University, Manhattan, Kansas; and *Archives in British History and Culture*, a series devoted to the publication of documents, at West Virginia University, Morgantown; and *Current Research in British Studies*, a quadrennial survey of research in progress in the United States and Canada, published at Southern Methodist University. The Conference has begun a new series, to be published by the Cambridge University Press, of biographical and historical studies of men and women who were makers and shapers of the English experience.
