

Coloured sets  $(2'' \times 2'')$  are also available, with notes, on the Athenian Agora, Athens, Lerna, Greek Papyri, Greek Gods and Heroes, Sicily and Magna Graecia, Roman Coins, Greek Sculpture, Greek and Roman Jewellery, Greek and Roman Terracottas, Gallia Narbonensis (the Greek sites) and the Trojan Horse in Classical Art. The sets on Pompeii, Art in Roman Britain, Classical Costume and the Roman Imperial Army in Britain (G. Webster) are also available in the form of film-strips. There is also a black and white set on Architecture  $(2'' \times 2'')$ .


The collection of  $3\frac{1}{4}$  ×  $3\frac{1}{4}$  black and white slides, numbering 10,000, covers a similarly wide range of subjects, and there are about 40 sets of slides on specific subjects.

A catalogue of coloured slides is available at 42p a copy.

Slides may be hired by members of each society at a charge of 50p a set, or  $1\frac{1}{2}p$  for individual slides, plus postage.

Copies of coloured slides may be bought for 25p each.

### **CROMER GREEK PRIZE**

WITH the view of maintaining and encouraging the study of Greek, particularly among the young, the first Earl of Cromer founded a Prize, to be administered by the British Academy, for the best Essay on any subject connected with the language, history, art, literature, or philosophy of Ancient Greece.

The next Prize, which is ordinarily a sum of  $f_{150}$ , will be awarded in 1972 under the following Rules:----

1. The competition is open to all British subjects and citizens of Eire of either sex who will be under thirty-two years of age on 31 December preceding the award.

2. Any Essay which has already received or is in competition for another prize of the same nature will be inadmissible. A candidate to whom the Prize has been awarded will not be eligible to compete for it again. But an Essay which has not received the Prize may be submitted again (with or without alteration) in a future year so long as the writer remains eligible under Rule 1.

3. Consideration of the adjudicators shall be limited to work submitted to them, whether published or unpublished, not exceeding 20,000 words in length.

4. Essays must be sent in to the Secretary of the Academy on or before 31 December of the year preceding the award. They must be typed or printed and should have a note attached stating the main sources of information used.
