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# NOMINATIONS TO THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

LATE IN SEPTEMBER all members will receive a ballot containing nominations to the Executive Council for the term 1964-67. Seven of these nominations were made by the present Council, and for the guidance of members we give below some biographical data about each.

BOYD G. CARTER, age 54, born Duffield, Va.; A.B., Coll. of William and Mary; A.M., Ph.D., Illinois; taught at Illinois, Idaho, Wyoming, Coe, Nebraska; now Professor of Romance Languages at Southern Illinois; author of studies on Spanish American literature and literary periodicals, French realism and naturalism, Duhamel; Palmes Académiques (1956).

MADELEINE DORAN, age 57, born Salt Lake City, Utah; A.B., Stanford; A.M., Iowa; Ph.D., Stanford; taught at Wellesley; now Professor of English at Wisconsin; has visited at Wellesley and Stanford; ACLS fellow (1933); AAUW fellow (1946); Huntington Library fellow (1960); author of studies on Shakespearean text, Elizabethan drama, Renaissance learning; editor of Elizabethan plays.

VICTOR ERLICH, age 48, born Petrograd, Russia; M.A., Free Polish Univ.; Ph.D., Columbia; has been res. writer on Yiddish Encyclopedia and has taught at Washington Univ.; this fall will be Professor of Slavic at Yale; Rockefeller fellow (1949); Ford fellow (1953); author of studies on modern Russian poetry; Soviet criticism; Gogol and Kafka.

ADOLF D. KLARMANN, age 58, born Austria; A.B., New York Univ.; Ph.D., Pennsylvania; has taught at Rochester and New York; now Professor of German and general literature at Pennsylvania; author of studies on eighteenth-, nineteenth- and twentieth-century German literature; German readings and composition; editor of the works of Franz Werfel.

PHILIP KOLB, age 55, born Chicago, Ill.; Ph.B., A.M., Chicago; Ph.D., Harvard; has taught at Williams and Cumberland; now Professor of French at Illinois; Center for Advanced Study (1960 and 1962); APS grants (1953, 1955); Fulbright fellow (1951); Croix de Guerre with Palm; Chevalier, Order of Leopold I; Prix de l'Acad. Française (1951); author of studies on modern and contemporary French literature; Marcel Proust.

GEORGE J. METCALF, age 55, born Kewanee, Ill.; A.B., Wabash; M.A., Ph.D., Harvard; has taught at Wabash, Harvard, Alabama, Kansas, and Washington (St. Louis); now Professor and Chairman of Germanics at Chicago; author of studies on German language and literature; history of diachronic linguistics; lexicography.

CLAUDE M. SIMPSON, age 53, born Kansas City, Mo.; A.B., Mus.B., and A.M., Southern Methodist; A.M., Ph.D., Harvard; has taught at East Carolina, Wisconsin; and Harvard; has visited at Stanford; now Professor of English at Ohio State; Fulbright (1950); author of studies on English and American balladry; American linguistics; American fiction; folk songs.

THREE additional names may be added on the Ballot by the Executive Secretary on 27 September (Bylaw IV, Items 2 and 3). The Secretary is required to add "the three names receiving the most votes among those proposed by members of the Association *provided that no name be entered on the Ballot that is not* supported by ten members." Any member may propose names. If names in addition to those above appear on this year's Ballot, you may learn biographical facts about them from the *Directory of American Schol*ars, from which, for your convenience, the above data were taken.
