East Africa which provide very useful sources for the study of Kenya agricultural history. Included in the collection are such journals as the East Africa Quarterly, East Africa Field, Farm and Garden, The Agricultural Journal of British East Africa, and Kenya Coffee. Oxford University Colonial Records Project (see also Africa xl, 2, 1970, p. 168)

THE project completed its task at the end of last year, but work continues on the preparation of guides to the larger collections of papers. Over eighty of these guides have so for been produced. As well as material of general Commonwealth interest, they describe papers concerned with specific territories—East, West, and Central Africa, the Middle and Far East, West Indies, Pacific, and other areas. Copies of guides concerning a particular region can be obtained from The Librarian, Rhodes House Library, Oxford, where the collections are housed. There is no charge, but refund of postage is welcomed.
