Single issues of the Journal and Bibliography, beginning with the May 1965 issue, cost \$8.00 plus postage and can be ordered from the Secretariat. Earlier issues may be purchased from A.M.S. Annual membership dues are \$20.00 (\$10.00 for full-time students) payable April 1.
