Annual membership dues are \$25.00 for Regular members, \$12.50 for Retired members and \$12.50 for Student members (full-time

students for 5 years only). Regular, Retired, and Student members receive the Journal of Asian Studies and the Asian Studies Newsletter.

Footnotes should be in the form recommended in the Style Sheet of the MLA (available from the Secretariat in Ann Arbor), typed double-spaced, and placed at the end of the manuscript. Manuscripts, including footnotes, should not be more than approximately 35 pages in length; the original and two clear copies should be submitted.

Books for review and correspondence concerning reviews should be sent to the appropriate editor. Books on Japan, Korra, and South Asia should be sent to the office of the editor; books on Southeast Asia should be sent to Professor A. B.
