INFORMATION FOR CONTRIBUTORS TO ANIMAL PRODUCTION

Animal Production publishes papers on original research provided that they have not been and, with the exception of authors' summaries, will not be published elsewhere without the Editors' written permission. Authors' summaries can be reproduced if full acknowledgement of the source is made.

Contributions may be in the field of animal production, or in any related scientific field. Reports on techniques will be published only as appendices to scientific papers. Results of research which do not warrant a comprehensive presentation may be submitted for consideration as *Notes*. Notes are not intended for the publication of interim results. They should not exceed 2000 words or the equivalent inclusive of tables and illustrations.

Manuscripts should be typewritten in double spacing with wide margins. Each page and the lines on each page should be numbered. *Two* copies of the typescript (one of illustrations) should be sent to

Manuscripts are not returned with proofs; authors should therefore retain copies.

For guidance to the general style which should be adopted in the writing and presentation of papers authors are referred to *General Notes on the Presentation of Scientific Papers* (2nd revised ed., 1965) published by the Royal Society, London (price 5s.). Points of detail applying particularly to *Animal Production* are given below.

Illustrations. The same material should not normally be presented in tables and figures. Legends should be typed on a separate sheet.

- (a) Diagrams should be drawn in Indian ink, about twice the size of the finished block, on Bristol board or stout tracing paper. Photographed diagrams are also accepted. Lettering inside the framework of the diagram should be inserted in Indian ink. Marginal lettering may, if preferred, be inserted lightly in pencil.
- (b) Photographs intended for half-tone reproduction should be on glossy paper. They will be accepted only if found necessary by the Editors.
- (c) Colour plates are unlikely to be accepted unless authors bear the cost.



In this quarterly journal, which covers the fields of human and animal nutrition, are published about 10,000 bibliographical references a year, over half of them accompanied by informative abstracts. The information contained in the volumes of Nutrition Abstracts and Reviews published since 1951, amounting at present to about 100,000 references, is now coded on punched cards for mechanical retrieval. The Bureau is prepared to answer enquiries and provide bibliographies on specific nutritional topics. In addition, sets of cards to be used in conjunction with the abstracts in the journal may be ordered.
