### 1. Mission Archives Series

This series of guides to the material on Africa in German mission archives is the result of a two-year pilot project directed by Adam Jones (University of Leipzig) and Gudrun Miehe (University of Bayreuth) with financial support from the Volkswagen Foundation. The aim is to make it easier for anthropologists, historians, linguists and others to find written or photographic material. The guides are in German, as is most of the material; but it is hoped to publish an English summary (excluding the lists of photographs) in the Internet.

### No. 1: Afrikabestände im Landeskirchlichen Archiv Nürnberg Bearbeitet von Anette Volk., 1998. ISBN 932632-27-3

A guide to archival material in Nürnberg relating to Lutheran German missionaries in East Africa (southern Kenya and northern Tanzania). Most of it concerns the papers of Johannes Raum (1875-1936), Fritz Wärthl (1884-1965) and Elisabeth Wärthl (1886-1975), all of whom worked for the Leipzig Mission. There is also some material on Matthias Ittameier, who founded the Hersbruck Mission in 1886. Pp. vii, 22.

The articles, most of which were based on reports written by missionaries in what are now southern Kenya and northern Tanzania, have been indexed in order to facilitate research. 2nd ed. In addition to documents relating to the Hersbruck Mission's work among the Kamba in the 1880s it lists diaries, correspondence, reports, photographs etc., mainly from the first half of the twentieth century, and the personnel files for missionaries sent to Tanganyika / Tanzania after the mid-1950s, when Neuendettelsau took over this task on behalf of the Leipzig Mission. # No. 1: Journal of a missionary tour to the Labaya country (Guinea / Conakry) in 1850, by Rev. John Ulrich Graf, Church Missionary Society.

An edited transcription of the journal of a missionary based in Freetown (Sierra Leone), who in 1850 visited part of what is today Guinea-Conakry, inhabited by Susu people. It is particularly informative about the protocols established in this region for commerce. The original text is supplemented by an introduction, a map, annotation and a detailed index. Pp. vi, 52.

### No. 2: Travels into the Baga and Soosoo Countries in 1821. By Peter McLachian

Edited by Bruce L. Mouser & Ramon Sarro, with a bibliography of the Baga by Ramon Sarro, 1999. ISBN 3-932632-42-7

A new edition of a work by Assistant Staff Surgeon Peter McLachlan, published in Freetown (Sierra Leone) in 1821. It was one of the first monographs published in tropical Africa and the first systematic attempt to describe the Baga and Susu. This edition is supplemented by an introduction, extensive annotation, maps, figures and an appendix. It also includes a substantial bibliography relating to the Baga peoples of coastal Guinea-Conakry.
