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Unlike most previous studies on modern East European history, this work seeks to give a systematic analysis of the causes of a major peasant revolt, stressing both long- and short-term factors. The author examines in detail Rumanian agrarian history between 1864 and the First World War. An attempt is made to treat Rumanian history in regional as well as national terms. Emphasis is placed on the dichotomy between Northeast (Northern Moldavia) and Southwest (Wallachia). Although there is much regional history in West European historiography, relatively little has appeared dealing with Eastern Europe. This has been particularly true of regions which are ethnically similar to each other.

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
