

This first major critical biography of Vladimir Nabokov allows, at last, full access to the dramatic details of the life and art of one of the century's greatest writers.

An intensely private man, Nabokov was a permanent wanderer. In the course of his ten years of work on the biography, Brian Boyd traveled along Nabokov's extensive trail, from Yalta to Palo Alto. The only scholar to have had free access to the Nabokov archives, he also interviewed at length Nabokov's family and scores of his friends and associates.

Here is an introduction to Nabokov—the man, his works, and his world—that will provide the basis for all future study. Among other accomplishments, Boyd dates and describes, for the first time, the composition of all of Nabokov's works (published and unpublished), including his fiction, dramas, memoirs, and major verse.

This first volume of a two-volume study is not only essential to an understanding of one of the most important writers of our time, but is fascinating reading in itself.
