1986 Conference on Hegel and his critics: Philosophy in the aftermath of Hegel First call for papers

THE Hegel Society of America will hold its ninth biennial meeting at Emory University, Atlanta, Georgia, on October 9 11, 1986. Papers for reading should primarily focus on the argumentative substance of Hegel's views, and how these bear up under the charges of his major critics. Preference will be given to papers which explore the resources of Hegel's thought to answer the justice of these charges and to contribute to continuing philosophical debates. Papers for the meeting should not exceed 30 minutes reading time, and should be submitted for consideration in this form. Each will be subject to and refereed by the Program Committee. Four copies of the paper should be submitted to the Program Chair:

Deadline for submission is January 30, 1986; a decision will be made by May 15, 1986.

It is hoped that papers can be published as a *Proceedings*, but presently this cannot be guaranteed. Nevertheless, submission and acceptance of a paper assumes that the author will reserve the first publication for the *Proceedings*.
