Notice to contributors

The editors welcome articles of general interest to psychiatrists. The Psychiatric Bulletin concentrates on provision of services to people with mental disorders, and psychiatric training. A good length is 1200 words; however, longer articles will be considered. Photographs to accompany articles, where appropriate, are welcome but diagrams and tables should usually not be included. In general there should be no more than five references. A brief summary of up to 100 words should be supplied with original articles.

Conference briefings and reviews should be no more than 500 words.

Correspondence on subjects of topical interest is also welcome but letters should be no more than 350 words, with up to three references, and should not include diagrams or tables.

The Psychiatric Bulletin operates an independent review system.

Contributions are accepted for publication on the condition that their substance has not been published or submitted for publication elsewhere. The views expressed in articles published in the Psychiatric Bulletin (except official College material) are the author's own and do not necessarily represent College policy.

Please send three copies of all submissions, typed double-spaced, and using the Harvard system of referencing as in The British Journal of Psychiatry.

All material submitted for publication in the Psychiatric Bulletin should be accompanied by a covering letter to the editors signed by all authors.

The editors wish to bring to the attention of authors that due to the increasing volume of high quality submissions the pressure on space will necessitate an increase in the rejection rate. The editors regret this but are determined to publish as many submissions as possible to maintain the current balance and range of articles, while continually striving to improve the standard of the Psychiatric Bulletin.
