The inquiry covers Ghana's relations with the great powers, specifically its developing ties with Moscow and Peking, and, more theoretically, the limits of the influence of a small state on the actions of the great powers. Ghana's primary aim to unite Africa is considered: the utility of the methods used is revealed, and the results in policy, of irredentism combined with ideology, are explored as they relate to Ghana's tangled relations with her neighbors. Throughout the study the author considers the effects of the domestic forces set loose by Nkrumah's attempt to import a new ideology.
