Contributions of about 10,000 words should be submitted by email to the editorial office with a message that includes your name, telephone number, and email address. Submissions should be sent as an attachment in the format .doc or .docx to <sic@tauex.tau.ac.il>. The editors require that the article be introduced by a paragraph of about 150 words that presents its argument.

The journal follows the author-date reference system that is generally used in the social and natural sciences.
