Advanced Training in Family Therapy 1985/86/87

Applications are invited for a multi-disciplinary clinical training in family therapy for experienced clinicians who are currently engaged in family therapy, who wish to develop their practice and who plan to promote supervision and training schemes within their own agencies.

A two year, one to two day per week programme will include clinical work with families in the Department for Children and Parents, with group supervision using video tapes and one-way mirror observation, together with theoretical and experinetial seminars, in various intergrative approaches including the possibility of a course in the Milan Systemic model. There will be opportunities for members to undertake supervised teaching practice.

A third year of one day per week is available for selected candidates to specialise in developing their skills in direct, "live" supervision. Applications from graduates of courses of similar standing would be considered for this third year.

FREUDENBERG FELLOWSHIP

The Mental Health Foundation invites applications from candidates interested in psychiatric rehabilitation or community care for a full-time Career Development Fellowship.

The Fellowship will enable the successful candidate to work in centres of excellence in Britain or abroad during a one- or two-year period. Towards the end of this time the Fellow will be expected to write an assessment of the services which he or she has seen in action. An extension of a further year may be granted if the report includes a satisfactory protocol for the development and monitoring of an aspect of service in the Fellow's own district.

Applicants should include, with the usual information about themselves, a list of preferred placements and the reason for choosing them, an account of how the suggested plan of work will enhance the development of their careers and what contribution they will expect to make to local services as a result. They should confirm that the directors of the preferred services agree to the placement.

Candidates should be psychiatrists of Senior Registrar status willing to work on pioneering projects to offer innovative alternatives to institutional care and development of nationwide services.

PRESCRIBING INFORMATION

Dosage: (Adults) Initially 25mg (0.5ml) by deep intramuscular injection into the gluteal region to assess susceptibility of patient. Dosage should be increased by increments of 25 or 50mg at appropriate intervals until a satisfactory response is obtained. Most patients respond to a dose of 50-100mg (1-2ml) every 4 weeks. Patients should be stabilised under

psychiatric supervision. Contra-indications:

Marked cerebral atherosclerosis, phaeochromocytoma, renal or liver failure, severe cardiac insufficiency or hypersensitivity to other phenothiazine derivatives.

Precautions:

A history of convulsive disorders or marked extra-pyramidal reactions to oral phenothiazines, in pregnancy and lactation

Side-effects:

Reversible extra-pyramidal reactions, sleep disturbance depression, blurred vision, asthenia, impotence, dry mouth, nausea, amenorrhoea, galactorrhoea, hypotension, hyperhydrosis and weight gain have been observed. occasionally. Corneal or lenticular cloudiness have not been observed with Piportil alone, but in treatment with phenothiazine preparations in high dosage over a long period, there is a risk of such side-effects occurring. Local reactions at site of injection are rare.
