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Format of papers

The title should be brief and to the point. If necessary, a subtitle may be used to amplify the main title. The names of the authors should appear on the title-page, and **their names, degrees, affiliations and full addresses at the end of the paper.**

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References should be listed **alphabetically** at the end of the paper, **the titles of journals being given in full.** Titles of books and journals are printed in italic and should therefore be underlined on the typescript. Reference lists not in *Journal* style will be returned to the author for correction.
