NEWS OF THE ASSOCIATION FOR THE STUDY OF THE NATIONALITIES (USSR & E.E.)

The Fifth Business Meeting of the ASN was held at the Capital Hilton Hotel in Washington, D.C., on October 15, 1982. There were 28 members present.

Stephan M. Horak, Chairman, and Andris Skreija, Secretary-Treasurer, offered a detailed report on the Association's activities for the period of December 1979 — October 1982.

- I. ASN sponsored in that period seven special sessions:

- 4. "Linkage of Economics and Politics Czechoslovakia, Poland, Romania, and Yugoslavia," and "Current Trends in National Dissent in the USSR." Thirteenth national convention of the AAASS, Monterey, Cal., September 20-23, 1981.
- 5. "East European National Minorities, 1919-1945: Conflicts and Solutions," and "Status of the Non-Russian Nationalities Studies in France and the United States." Fourteenth national convention of the AAASS, Washington, D.C., October 14-17, 1982.

II. Publications.

In ASN "Series in Issues Studies (USSR and East Europe)" appeared two additional volumes:

- III. Nationalities Papers, semi-annual journal published since 1972, appears regularly in the Spring and Fall. An Index to volumes I-X (1972-1982) was published in 1982 and is available to all interested persons from the Editor. As of December 1982, there are 238 individual and 152 institutional subscribers in 25 different countries. An additional 29 copies

are distributed on an exchange basis, and of each issue some 25 copies are sent out for promotional purposes. Forty copies are retained to fill requests for back issues.

VI. Related activities.

At ASN initiative a group of ASN members, with financial assistance by the U.S. Department of Education, prepared for publication in 1982, Guide to the Study of the Soviet Nationalities: Non-Russian Peoples of the USSR. Littleton, Col.: Libraries Unlimited, 1982. 265p. \$30.00. Editor: Stephan M. Horak; Contributors: Marjorie Mandelstam Balzer, David M. Crowe, Kenneth C. Farmer, Stephen Fischer-Galati, Sidney Heitman, Vitaut Kipel, Isabelle Kreindler, Edward J. Lazzerini, Joseph D. McCadden, Shimon Redlich, and James L. Heizer.

At the present, a consecutive volume is being prepared for publication: "Eastern Europe National Minorities, 1919-1980: A Handbook." Another U.S. Department of Education grant made this project possible, which is scheduled for publication in 1984. This volume deals with the following countries: Poland, GDR, Czechoslovakia, Romania, Hungary, Austria, Yugoslavia, Bulgaria, and Albania.

It was the general concensus of those present at the business meeting that this was the most successful period since the Association's inception. Its contribution to the rising interest in the area of the non-Russian nationalities and national minorities of the East European states as well as to such issues as national and human rights, has been acknowledged in American and Western scholarship. Therefore, the past achievements should serve as a stimulant for the members of the ASN for their future activities and scholarship. There remains much to be accomplished for the next two years,

a task which requires continuity of cohesiveness on the part of the membership, productive scholarship in form of new monographs, manuscripts for publication in N.P., and last but not least, promotion of the ASN publications and generous membership support in the form of life-time subscriptions to *Nationalities Papers* and contributions to ASN, which are tax deductible.

INFORMATION FOR CONTRIBUTORS

Nationalities Papers welcomes manuscripts from members of the ASN and others specializing in subjects and areas of the Association's interest. All manuscripts should be submitted in duplicate, double-spaced and typed on one side of the page only. Footnotes should be typed double-spaced at the end of the paper. Cyrillic alphabets should be transliterated according to the Library of Congress system, without diacritical marks. Manuscripts should not exceed 30 pages in length (including notes). In all matters of style, the practice recommended by K. L. Turabian, A Manual for Writers, 4th ed., is normally followed. Book reviews should give complete bibliographic description. Unsolicited book reviews are not accepted.

Manuscripts will not be returned unless specifically requested and postage is provided. The policy of the *Nationalities Papers* is not to consider materials published elsewhere.
