NOTES ON CONTRIBUTORS

DAVID P. CRANDALL teaches in the Department of Anthropology at Brigham Young University in Provo, Utah. In 1992 he completed at Oxford his doctoral thesis on the Himba of Namibia.

CHAPURUKHA M. KUSIMBA is an Assistant Curator of African Archaeology and Ethnology at the Field Museum of Natural History in Chicago. He also teaches in the Department of Anthropology at the University of Illinois. Since 1986 he has been working on the archaeology of Kenya's Swahili coast, and is carrying out long-term excavations near Mombasa at the Swahili site of Mtwapa (c. AD 1100–1750).

PIERRE PETIT teaches at the University of Liège in Belgium and also has a research appointment at the Free University of Brussels where in 1993 he was awarded his doctorate for a study of the rituals of the Luba in the Shaba province of Zaire.
