The Society for Theatre Research invites applications for grants from its research fund for the academic year 1993-4. It is hoped that there will be two major awards and a number of smaller grants, all payable in sterling.

There is no restriction as to status or nationality, nor on the location of the proposed research. However, the topic must be substantially concerned with the history and practice of the British theatre, including music hall, opera, dance and other associated performing arts. Exclusively textual, literary or aesthetic topics are not eligible, nor are applications for course fees unless for specific professional training techniques, in which case evidence will be required to show eligibility for such training and details of the established training schemes in question.

The Society welcomes proposals which in their execution extend the methods and techniques of historiography.

In coming to a decision the Research Sub-Committee will take into consideration the progress already made by the applicant, and the possible availability of other possible subvention.

Further details will be available on application towards the end of the year. Completed applications will be required in February 1993.

#### THEATRE RESEARCH / RECHERCHES THEATRALES

The International Federation published the journal Theatre Research/Recherches Théâtrales from 1959 to 1975 when it was succeeded by Theatre Research International. During these years many important articles of original research were published covering the whole field of theatre history from the earliest times, and particularly Shakespeare and the Elizabethan period, to more recent figures such as Strindberg, Craig and Beckett. There have been special issues on the themes of Opera, the Playwright as Director, and Reinhardt; a check-list of world theatre on records; and reports on International Conferences and Symposia of the I.F.T.R.

In all 14 volumes were published in 36 issues including a complete index. Most back issues are still available.
