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
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
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


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Cover: Since its discovery in 2002 the colony of Critically Endangered northern bald ibis Geronticus eremita in Syria remains at perilously low numbers. Satellite tracking of adults has now shown they migrate through Jordan, Saudi Arabia and Yemen to winter in Ethiopia. Although the adults appear to be at low risk on the wintering site, threats along the migration route need to be assessed and the unknown movements of subadults and young birds determined.
