Manuscripts should be typed on 8 1/2 x 11 bond, double-spaced. Footnotes should be in the form recommended in A Manual of Style, 12th ed. (Chicago: Univ. of Chicago Press, 1969), typed double-spaced, and placed at the end of the manuscript. Manuscripts, including footnotes, should not be more than 50 pages in length; the original and two clear copies should be submitted.
