

The Arthur Prior Memorial Conference

On August 18-23, 1989 an international joint session of the Australasian Associations of Philosophy and Logic will be held to mark the twentieth anniversary of Prior's death. Papers are invited on Prior, his work, and the subjects on which he wrote (for example, tense logic, modal logic, ethics, determinism, intensionality, ontology, time and change, self reference, indexicals, inferential definition, Aristotelian and medieval logic, logic and religion, epistemic, deontic and erotetic logics). The intention is to publish a selection of the conference proceedings in a Memorial Volume. The venue will be the University of Canterbury, New Zealand, where Prior held the Chair of Philosophy until 1958.
