Islam is to-day the living faith of some two hundred and eighty believers, and is, as it always has been, remarkable for the firmness of its hold over its followers. A religious system which satisfies the needs of so many millions, and which is a missionary religion still gaining adherents by conversion from other groups, cannot but make its claim on our attention.

It was with this in mind that the present Reader has been compiled by the late Professor Arthur Jeffery. One pitfall in the compilation of such a Reader is that the selections represent only what a non-Muslim thinks are passages representative of the religion of Islam. To avoid this, Muslims have selected the passages to be used.

All the material in this Reader save the notes and explanatory rubrics has been written by Muslims, and all the translation is an attempt to make what they say intelligible to the English-speaking student. The selections begin with the Scripture of the Muslims, the Qu'rān, pass on to the Traditions, which give what the early generations of believers reported as the sayings and doings of their Prophet. These sections are followed by selections from various types of religious writing which illustrate the practical and devotional life of Islam. In every case the passage chosen has been translated completely, and have all been made directly from the Arabic texts.

This book is, as far as we know, the first in this field, and will prove an indispensable to all students of Islam and of comparative religion.
