I Spit On Life (c. 1953–1954) by William Kurelek (1927–1977)

There is renewed interest in the Canadian artist William Kurelek with a major survey of his work, *Kurelek: The Messenger* (http://kurelek.ca/). *I Spit on Life* is one of several works Kurelek painted while a patient in the Maudsley and Netherne Hospitals between



1952 and 1955. At Netherne he had art therapy with Edward Adamson (1911–1996), the pioneering art therapist, who held a daily progressive art studio from 1946 to 1981. The painting is of a vast wall on which scenes from his life in Canada and England are shown – some cropped by the boundary. At the centre, Kurelek is chained to the wall in his Netherne studio, a disused linen room that Adamson found for him. At the bottom of the wall, behind asylum perimeters, the bleak scenes may anticipate Kurelek's 1954 suicide attempt.
