

Contributors are asked to follow the 'Instructions for Contributors', NTS 38 (1992) 157–60. Typescripts should not exceed 8,500 words (including footnotes) in length. Contributors are also asked to supply an abstract of their article, not exceeding 100 words in length. (Abstracts for Short Studies should be correspondingly shorter.) Each contributor will receive a copy of the number and 25 offprints of his or her article free of charge. Authors will be responsible for all alterations to proofs which exceed 20% of the cost of composition.
