### UNIVERSITY OF NIJMEGEN, HOLLAND POST-GRADUATE COURSE IN EAR SURGERY FROM 17 APRIL TO 23 APRIL 1977

THE Department of Otolaryngology, University of Nijmegen, Holland, desires to announce that the 12th post-graduate course in ear surgery will be held from April 17 to April 23, 1977. The course will be organized by Professor W. F. B. Brinkman and his Staff, assisted by Dr. H. C. Overbosch, Holland; Prof. J. J. Marquet, Belgium; Dr. W. Offermann, W. Germany; Mr. J. D. K. Dawes and Mr. W. M. S. Ironside, Great Britain.

The course, which will be given in English, will include lectures, panel discussions, films, televised operations (colour), temporal bone dissections and studies of anatomical specimens.

The fee of 2200 D.Fl. will include hotel accommodation and meals. The course is intended for certified E.N.T. specialists and registration will be limited. A ladies' programme will be arranged. ### RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS IN OTOLARYNGOLOGY

THE Department of Otolaryngology (Chairman, Professor D. B. ### COURSE FOR POST-GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN AUDIOLOGY

A FULL-TIME ONE-YEAR COURSE in AUDIOLOGY for a Post-graduate Diploma at the University of Melbourne will commence in February 1977.

The course of instruction in audiology will be conducted at the University of Melbourne in the Department of Otolaryngology and in close association with clinics at the Royal Victorian Eye and Ear Hospital, the Royal Children's Hospital, the National Acoustic Laboratories and the State Health Department, Melbourne.

It will consist of a comprehensive series of lectures, demonstrations, seminars and tutorials on audiology, and the physical and biological sciences associated with it, and will include clinical work in all areas of audiology. Instruction in the basic sciences will cover acoustics, anatomy, biophysics, linguistics, physiology and psychology. Instruction in audiology will cover audiometry, educational audiology, general audiology, geriatric audiology, hearing aids, industrial audiology, otolaryngology, paediatric audiology, and speech and language.

Applications for the course in 1977 will close on 1 December 1976.

### COURSE IN LARYNGOLOGY AND BRONCHOSOPHAGOLOGY

1 NOVEMBER THROUGH 6, 1976
