The Journal of Asian Studies, known until September 1956 as the Far Eastern Quarterly, is published by the Association for Asian Studies (formerly The Far Eastern Association) in November, February, May, and August. The annual institutional subscription rate is \$30.00, postage included. Subscribers also receive the annual Bibliography and Professional Review. Single issues of the Journal and Bibliography, beginning with the May 1965 issue, cost \$8.00 plus postage for non-members and can be ordered from the Secretariat. Earlier issues may be purchased from A.M.S. Reprints, 56 E. 13th Street, New York, New York 10003.

Annual membership dues are \$20.00 for Regular members, \$10.00 for Retired members and \$10.00 for Student members (full-time students for 5 years only). Regular, Retired, and Student members receive the Journal of Asian Studies, the annual Bibliography of Asian Studies, the Asian Studies Professional Review, and the Asian Studies Newsletter. Second class postage paid at Ann Arbor, Michigan and at Richmond, Virginia.

Individual and back issues of the Journal and Bibliography to the membership cost \$6.00 plus postage for Regular members, and \$4.00 plus postage for Student and Retired members. Manuscripts for publication and correspondence concerning articles should be submitted to Professor Ralph W. Nicholas. Editor, Journal of Asian Studies, The University of Chicago, 1126 E. 50th St., Chicago, Illinois 60637. Manuscripts should be typed on 8½ × 11 bond, double-spaced. Footnotes should be in the form recommended in the Style Sheet of the MLA (available from the Secretariat in Ann Arbor), typed double-spaced, and placed at the end of the manuscript. Manuscripts, including footnotes, should not be more than approximately 35 pages in length; the original and two clear copies should be submitted.

Books for review and correspondence concerning reviews should be sent to the appropriate editor: Books on Japan and South Asia should be sent to the office of the editor; books on Southeast Asia should be sent to Professor A. B. Hudson, R.D. 2, Amherst, Mass. 01002; books on China and Inner Asia should be sent to Professor Robert A. Kapp, Institute for Comparative and Foreign Area Studies DR-05. University of Washington, Seattle, Washington 98195; books on Korea should be sent to Dr. E. David Rockstein, Department of Uralic and Altaic Studies, Indiana University, Bloomington, Indiana 47401.

The Asian Studies Professional Review is published annually by the Association for Asian Studies, Inc. Material for the Review

should be typed, double-spaced and sent to the appropriate members of the editorial staff by November 1.
