*Provincial Politics in the French Revolution* is a study of two provincial towns—one federalist, the other Jacobin—during a crisis period of the Revolution. Focusing on the political elite of the towns of Caen and Limoges, Paul R. Hanson explores the nature and causes of the revolt against Paris and the Montagnards. Through his examination of two towns involved in the revolt, Hanson clarifies and distinguishes those variables that directly influenced the decision of local governments to support either the federalists or the Montagnards.
