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The Zat Pwe is an all-night performance of music, song, dance, drama, and comedy that has been a culture fixture in Myanmar for centuries. As Kathryn Hansen's article in this issue suggests, the enduring importance of the Zat Pwe in Myanmar society might have been one reason why Parsi theatre never became popular beyond colonial Rangoon.
