

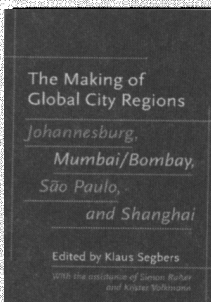

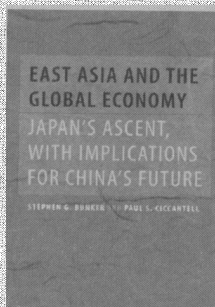

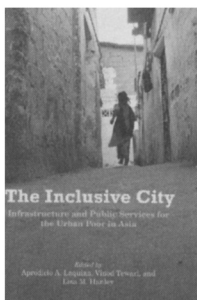
### Water Policy for Sustainable Development
