CENTENARY OF L. VON SCHRÖTTER.

On the 30th of January, the University of Vienna and the Vienna Laryngo-Rhinological Society celebrated the one hundredth birthday of Leopold von Schrötter, born on February 5th, 1837, one of the great pioneers of our speciality. Von Schrötter was the founder and first Chief of the first Laryngological University Clinic of Vienna. He also was one of the pioneers of the modern fight against tuberculosis. Near Vienna, in Alland, he founded and built the first climato-dietetic establishment for tuberculous patients, which has served as a model for similar institutions since that time.

The University of Vienna has put up in the Arkadenhof of the University a marble tablet with the medallion of von Schrötter, which was made by the Professor von Zumbusch. The Rector of the University, Professor Arzt, the Dean of the medical faculty, Professor Kerl, Professor Sorgo as late pupil and assistant of Schrötter and as Internist, Professor Marschik as laryngologist and President of the Vienna Laryngo-Rhinological Society, made speeches in his honour.

The week from July 29th till August 4th has provisionally been settled for the Congress.


