

Lecturer/Senior Lecturer/Demonstrators in Geology

Applications are invited for the above positions. Applicants for the Lectureship/Senior Lectureship will be required to give undergraduate courses in Palaeontology, to be responsible for the supervision of postgraduate students to the Ph.D. level and to undertake such other duties as may be assigned by the Head of the Department. Appointment to the grade of Lecturer or Senior Lecturer will be determined by the teaching and research background of the successful applicant. Applicants for the Lectureship should also state whether they seek a permanent or short-term appointment. The latter type is available only to residents of overseas countries and at the level of Lecturer.

The Demonstrators, who should possess an Honours Degree or the equivalent, will be expected to carry out such duties as may be required by the Head of the Department. These duties will include the supervision of First Year practical classes in all branches of Geology and in higher years, in their own special fields. One appointee should have qualifications in Palaeontology. All candidates must state their special research interests. Appointees will be expected to enrol for a higher degree.

Commencing salary will be fixed according to qualifications and experience within the range of £A1,730 × £105–£A2,435 for a Lecturer, £A2,550 × £95–£A3,000 for a Senior Lecturer, and £A1,120–£A1,720 for a Demonstrator. Cost of living adjustment at present is £A42 per annum. Superannuation, housing, and provisions for study leave are available for a permanent Lecturer/Senior Lecturer. Travel and removal expenses are payable for appointments at the level of Senior Lecturer, Lecturer, and Demonstrator.
