These international bulletins are providing cumulatively, information concerning current research in the social sciences and humanities, in universities and research organisations throughout the world.

With the publication in August 1973 of *Current Africanist Research* No. 3, the volumes will have listed over 5000 projects in the fields of archaeology and prehistory, the arts, economics and development studies, education, history, labour studies, languages and literature, law studies, politics and administration, population studies, psychology and child development, religion and philosophy, social organisation and social change, and urban studies. Information provided under each entry covers briefly: topic, name of research worker, methods, dates of starting and expected completion, organisations under whose auspices the work is being carried out, and other sources of funds.

Each volume also contains an introductory section giving news of research developments in African universities and on the formation of new research institutes and centres. The volumes are comprehensively indexed.

Current Africanist Research (£4.00/\$10/50 fr., plus postage, for each volume) is intended to be used with the Register of Organisations undertaking Africanist Research (March 1971, price £3.00 plus postage). Both publications are indispensable for any university or departmental library specialising in African studies.
