The International Commission on Zoological Nomenclature has received the following **Applications**, which were published recently in the *Bulletin of Zoological Nomenclature*. Case 2810. *Rhabdomeson* Young & Young, 1874 (Bryozoa): proposed designation of *Rhabdomeson progracile* Wyse Jackson & Bancroft, 1995 as the type species. Abstract. The purpose of this application is to conserve the current understanding of the name *Rhabdomeson* Young & Young, 1874 which is in established usage for a genus of Carboniferous bryozoans. Young & Young misidentified

as *Millepora gracilis* Phillips, 1841 the single species that they included in the genus. We (1995) have named the taxon *Rhabdomeson progracile* and propose that this be designated as the type species.

Case 2984. Monograptus riccartonensis Lapworth, 1876 (Graptolithina): proposed designation of a neotype. Abstract. The purpose of this application is to propose a neotype for Monograptus riccartonensis Lapworth, 1876, a graptolite upon which Tullberg (1882) based the *M. ric-cartonensis* Zone of Wenlock (Silurian) age. Pribyl (1948) designated as lectotype one of Lapworth's type specimens which belongs to another species and is from strata significantly older than the *M. riccartonensis* Zone.

- Opinion 1803. *Robulina nodosa* Reuss, 1863 (currently *Lenticulina nodosa*; Foraminiferida): neotype confirmed as the name-bearing type.
- Opinion 1804. Cristellaria humilis Reuss, 1863 (currently Astacolus humilis; Foraminiferida): neotype replaced by rediscovered lectotype, and Rotalia schloenbachi (currently Notoplanulina? schloenbachi; Foraminiferida): placed on the Official List.
- Opinion 1806. Animonites nodosus (currently Ceratites nodosus; Cephalopoda, Ammonoidea): specific name attributed to Schlotheim, 1813, and a lectotype designated.
