

CHEMISTRY IN THE SERVICE OF MEDICINE

F. N. L. POYNTER

The twelve papers that appear in this book were first heard at the Second British Congress on the History of Medicine and Pharmacy, organised by the Faculty of the History of Medicine and Pharmacy of the Worshipful Society of Apothecaries, held in London in September 1961.

Certainly medicine has come a long way from the potions of the Renaissance "chymists" to the "wonder" drugs of the present day, but considering the limitations imposed by primitive facilities for research, the degree of both practical and theoretical progress in chemistry was astonishing. The papers give an absorbing account of the bitter rivalries and wrangling between the various schools of thought—particularly between the Aristotelian-Galenic and the Neoplatonic-Paracelsian partisans, from which the latter emerged triumphant; they tell of the great philosophers, religious antagonism with which early scientists had to contend, the emergence of analytical methods and experimental investigation, the remarkable discoveries of Lavoisier, van Helmont, Wöhler, Fludd, Boerhaave and others, and the spectacular advances in chemistry and medicine since the nineteenth century.
