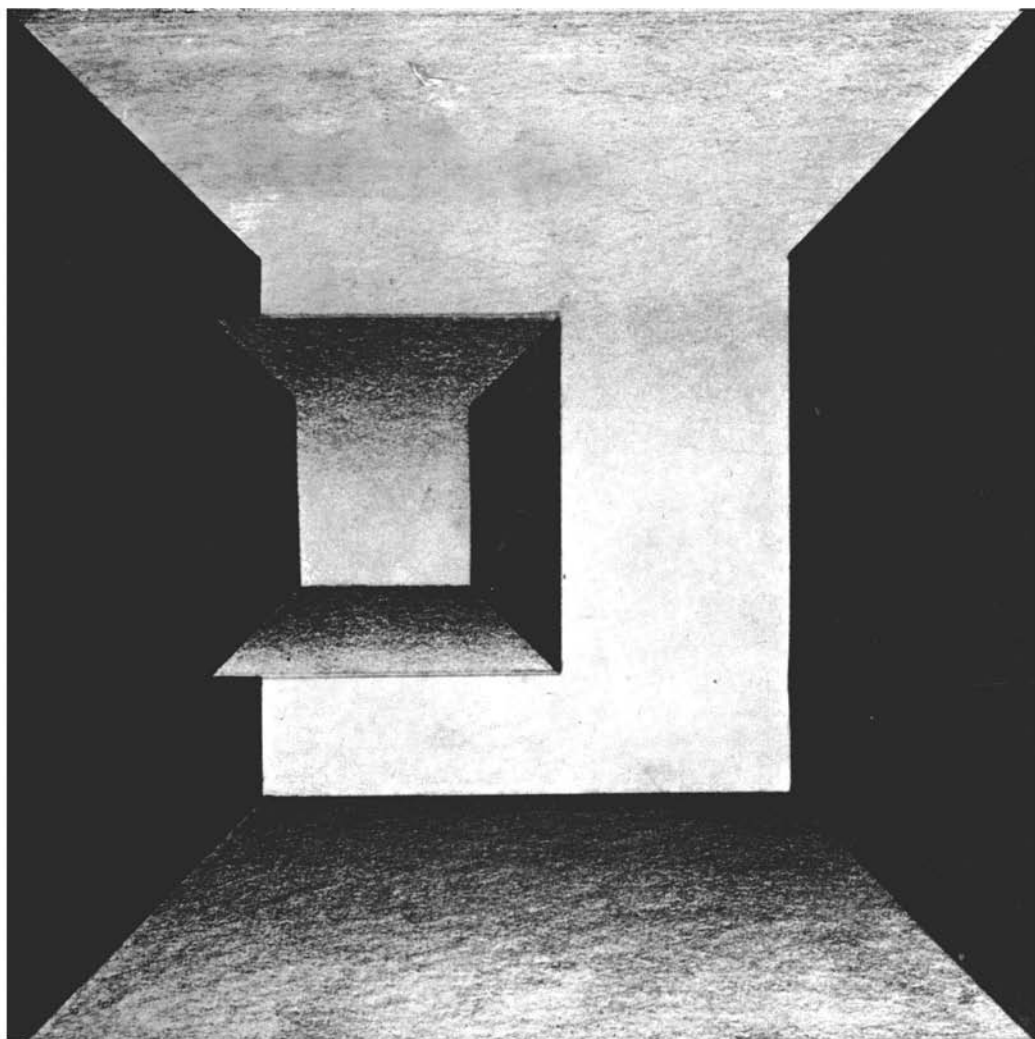

A computer produced catalogue-index to productions of the Shakespeare Memorial/Royal Shakespeare Theatre 1879-1978.

This invaluable guidebook lists each production by play title, supplying the date of the first performance, the playwright, the director, the lighting designers, actors and roles, and a list of reviews and reviewers. Separate indexes to playwrights, theatre personnel, and reviewers provide instant access to information about individuals. A chronology, listing performances year-by-year, enables researchers to trace theatrical developments over time.

By answering the all-important questions – what was done, when, and who did it – this unique reference tool makes the Stratford theatre archives truly useful to students and scholars for the first time.

Theatre Research International is the continuation of *Theatre Research/Recherches Théâtrales*. The change of title marks the assumption by Oxford University Press of responsibility for publication. The new title also indicates that the association with the International Federation for Theatre Research/Fédération Internationale pour la Recherche Théâtrale, which founded the journal, will remain. Bilingualism has not been entirely abandoned: contributions appear only in English, but articles are provided with *résumés* in French. The field continues to be the historical, critical and theoretical study and documentation of drama, conceived as the art of the theatre.

New readers might like to learn that the motif on our cover was designed by Josef Svoboda for *Theatre Research/Recherches Théâtrales* in 1966 and presented to the International Federation for Theatre Research/Fédération Internationale pour la Recherche Théâtrale.
