The annual institutional subscription rate is \$40.00, postage included. Single issues of the *Journal* and *Bibliography*, beginning with the May 1965 issue, cost \$10.00 plus postage for non-members and can be ordered from the Secretariat. Earlier issues may be purchased from A.M.S. Reprints, 56 E. 13th Street, New York 10003.

Annual membership dues are \$25.00 for Regular members, \$12.50 for Retired members and \$12.50 for Student members (full-time students for 5 years only). Regular, Retired, and Student members receive the *Journal of Asian Studies* and the *Asian Studies Newsletter*. Second-class postage paid at Ann Arbor, Michigan and at Richmond, Virginia.

Kapp, Editor *Journal of Asian Studies*, DR-05, University of Washington, Seattle, Washington 98195. Manuscripts should be typed on 8½ × 11 bond, double-spaced. Footnotes should be in the form recommended in the *MLA Handbook* (N.Y., 1977), typed double-spaced, and placed at the end of the manuscript. Manuscripts, including footnotes, should not be more than approximately 35 pages in length; the original and two clear copies should be submitted.
