Single issues of the Journal and Bibliography, beginning with the May 1965 issue, cost \$10.00 plus postage for non-members and can be ordered from the Secretariat. Individual and back issues of the *Journal* and *Bibliography* to the membership cost \$7.00 plus postage for Regular members, and \$4.00 plus postage for Student and Retired members. Manuscripts for publication and correspondence concerning articles should be submitted to Professor Robert A. Kapp, Editor Journal of Asian Studies, DR-05, University of Washington, Seattle, Washington 98195. Manuscripts should be typed on 8½ × 11 bond, doublespaced. Footnotes should be in the form recommended in the MLA Handbook (N.Y., 1977), typed double-spaced, and placed at the end of the manuscript. Manuscripts, including footnotes, should not be more than approximately 35 pages in length; the original and two clear copies should be submitted.

Books for review and correspondence concerning reviews should be sent to the appropriate editor. Books on *Asia General, China*, and *Central Asia* should be sent to the office of the editor; books on *Japan* should be sent to Professor Byron K.
