To the Reader:

The role of Igor Kavass, as many of you know and appreciate, in the achievements of the Journal is immeasurable and beyond adequate description within these few lines. Suffice it to say that he has performed the full range of tasks necessary to the publication and continued life of the Journal, often doing this when it was not his responsibility and without taking any public credit for shouldering the burden. Without his initial encouragement, support and participation, many of the innovative ideas
