# Calendar of Assize Records Sussex Indictments James I

Criminal trials over a period of time might be a reflection of the prevailing social economic and political climate of that period. A prominent feature of this book is the large number of serious crimes including many cases of murder, sedition, riot and infanticide. It shows the severe punishments which were meted out to those found guilty. Hanging was commonplace. 'Cecily Paine on 20 September 1607 burgled the house of Richard Boler at Wiggenholt and stole a smock (2s.), an apron (6d) and 2 coifs (6d) belonging to Boler and a purse (1d) containing (2s.) in money belonging to John Pratt. She was hanged'.
