The Francis McNaughton Prize

presented by
The Canadian Neurological Society

- *Awarded annually for the best paper in clinical research done during the neurology residency or in post residency training.
- *Junior members of the Canadian Neurological Society and Active members within two years of certification are eligible.
- *Papers should be prepared in the format prescribed in the Canadian Journal of Neurological Sciences and submitted in triplicate to Dr. C.W. McCormick, c/o Secretariat, Canadian Congress of Neurological Sciences.

The André Barbeau Memorial Prize

presented by
The Canadian Neurological Society

- *Awarded annually for the best paper in clinical research done during the neurology residency or in post residency training.
- *Junior members of the Canadian Neurological Society and Active members within two years of certification are eligible.
- *Papers should be prepared in the format prescribed in the Canadian Journal of Neurological Sciences and submitted in triplicate to Dr. C.W. McCormick, c/o Secretariat, Canadian Congress of Neurological Sciences.

The K.G. McKenzie Memorial Prize and Award

presented by
The Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada
in cooperation with The Canadian Neurosurgical Society

- *The McKenzie Prize is awarded to the best paper submitted by a neurosurgical resident in which he or she is the principal author. A second prize will also be awarded.
- *The McKenzie Training or Research Award is awarded to support specific training or research.
- *Applicants must be a resident in training in a Canadian Neurosurgical Training program, or within two years of having received certification for fellowship in Neurosurgery.

- *Awarded annually for the best submitted paper in clinical or basic neurophysiology by a resident or fellow in training. Others within three years of doctorate or a fellowship are also eligible.
- *Full papers should be prepared in the format prescribed by the Canadian Journal of Neurological Sciences and include a report of the research project findings and relevant related materials.
- *Submit applications in triplicate to Dr. Michael Jones, c/o Secretariat, Canadian Congress of Neurological Sciences.

The President's Prize

presented by
The Canadian Association for Child Neurology

- *Awarded annually for the best paper in pediatric neuroscience submitted by a resident in training or a fellow.
- *Manuscripts should be prepared in the format prescribed by the Canadian Journal of Neurological Sciences and submitted in triplicate to: Dr. Shashi Seshia, c/o Secretariat, Canadian Congress of Neurological Sciences.
