ACCURATE

Sheila Lambert has produced a collection remarkable for its accuracy. Using the Journal entries which provide titles and dates of the orders to print the papers and the virtually complete printers' accounts in the Treasury warrants for much of the period, she has dated and described, in the two list volumes, every paper printed by the House from the accession of George I to the beginning of the nineteenth century. In so doing, she has corrected a variety of textual errors that have frustrated serious historians. The accuracy of the Scholarly Resources edition greatly facilitates research.

DIVERSE

The House of Commons Sessional Papers of the Eighteenth Century is obviously necessary to the study of English politics. However, the value of this collection goes far beyond the study of politics. Because of the nature of the eighteenth-century Parliament, these papers are critical for the study of economic development, welfare and social reform, military and naval affairs, colonial relations, imperial development, and diplomacy. Because of its range and diversity, this is a valuable resource even for the beginner in the field; for the graduate student and professional historian, it is vital.

ORGANIZED

While preserving the traditional arrangement of bills, reports and accounts and papers, a topical arrangement of the papers within each session, as opposed to the strict chronological order of the originals regardless of the topic, greatly simplifies research.

CONVENIENT

The Scholarly Resources edition, reproduced in facsimile, provides documents which, in many cases, are more legible and convenient than the originals. By using sophisticated photographic and publishing techniques, Scholarly Resources has arranged the material in a uniform format, largely eliminated problems of uneven inking and "bleed-through" in the originals, and reproduced the charts and diagrams which are integral to the papers.
