I am glad to announce that Volume 2 of *Language in Society* will be substantially larger than Volume 1. Each of the two issues will have about 160 pages. Increase in size will require an increase in cost, but greater size has been found necessary, if the journal is to fulfil its role, and respond at all flexibly and promptly to the diversity and development of the field. Even before public announcement of the existence of the journal, excellent material enough to fill the first three issues had come to hand.

(It should be noted that while the present issue is notably smaller than the first, the two together make a Volume 1 that is larger than had been scheduled. I am grateful to the Press for agreeing to the considerably oversize first issue, as a way of indicating the desired scope of the journal more adequately.)

With great regret we record the death of W. H. Whiteley, a member of our Editorial Board and of its executive committee. An obituary article will appear in the next issue.
