Ernst-Wolfgang Böckenförde (Dr. iur., Dr. phil., Dr. iur. h.c., Basel, 1987) is professor emeritus of public law, constitutional history, and legal theory at the University of Freiburg (Germany). From 1983 until 1996 he was a judge of the Federal Constitutional Court in Germany. He is the author of several books.

David Dyzenhaus (B.A., LL.B, Witwatersrand; D.Phil., Oxford, 1988) is Associate Professor of Law and Philosophy at the University of Toronto. He is the author of *Hard Cases in Wicked Legal Systems* and *Truth's Revenge: Carl Schmitt, Hans Kelsen, and Hermann Heller in Weimar.*

Robert Howse (B.A., LL.B., Toronto; LL.M., Harvard, 1990) is Associate Profess of Law and Associate Director, Centre for the Study of State and Market, University of Toronto. His translation with commentary of Alexandre Kojeve's *Esquisse d'une phenomenologie due droit* (co-authored with Bryan-Paul Frost) is forthcoming in 1997.

Ellen Kennedy (B.A., Trinity College; Ph.D., London School of Economics, 1977) is Associate Professor of Political Science at The University of Pennsylvania. She is the translator of Carl Schmitt's *The Crisis of Parliamentary Democracy*.

Dominique Leydet (B.A., McGill; M.A., Paris IV; Doctorat, École des Hautes Études en Sciences Sociales, 1990) is Associate Professor of Philosophy at Université du Québec à Montréal.
