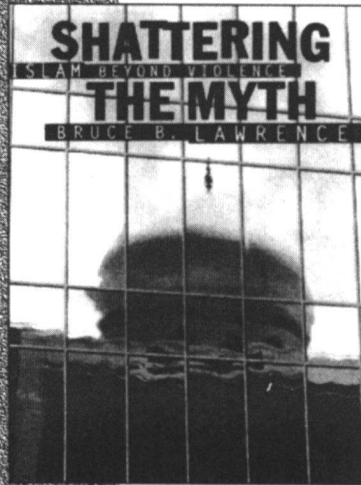

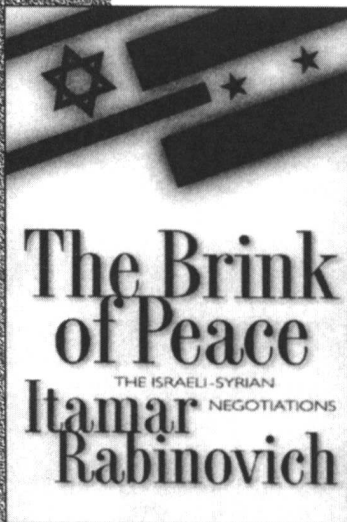

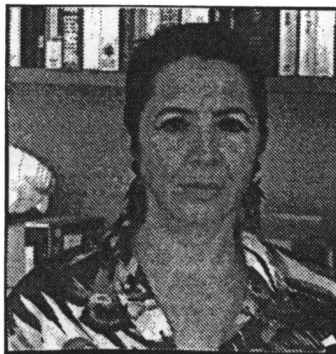

She presently teaches Arabic Language and Literature at the University of Sydney, Australia. Her second novel, *Lina: Portrait of a Damascene Girl*, was published by Three Continents in 1995 in the author's own translation.

Against a background of Morocco's struggle for independence from French colonial rule, Abouzeid's autobiography charts the development of personal relationships, between generations as well as between husbands and wives. Her father is a central figure; as a strong advocate of Moroccan nationalism, he was frequently imprisoned by the French, and his family was forced to flee the capital. Si Hmed was a public hero, but the young daughter's memories of her famous father and of the family's plight because of his political activities are not so idyllic.

Power and Authority in Moroccan Sufism

This book presents a systematic history of Moroccan Sufism through the fifteenth and sixteenth centuries C.E. and a comprehensive study of Moroccan Sufi doctrine, focusing on the concept of sainthood. Cornell engages in a sociohistorical analysis of Sufi institutions, a critical examination of hagiography as a source for history, a study of the Sufi model of sainthood in relation to social and political life, and a sociological analysis of more than three hundred biographies of saints. He concludes by identifying eight indigenous ideal types of saint that are linked to specific forms of authority. Taken together, they define sainthood as a socioreligious institution in Morocco.

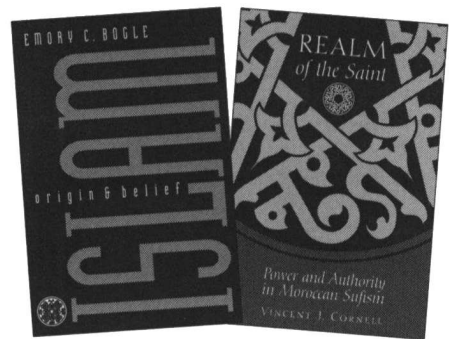
