In an effort to encourage Leibniz scholarship and give recognition to outstanding investigators, the Leibniz Society announces its sixth essay competition. The rules are as follows. Papers should be on some aspect of the philosophy of Leibniz and under twenty-five pages in length. They may be written in English, French, or German. To facilitate anonymous judging, the author's identity should be indicated only on a separate title page or cover sheet. Judges reserve the right not to name a winner (a right they exercised in the 1987 competition). Suitability for oral presentation may play a role in the judging. Previous winners are not excluded from the competition, but other things being approximately equal, a person who had not won before would be chosen over a previous winner. The author(s) of the winning essay will be invited to deliver the paper at the Leibniz Society Session held in conjunction with either the Central of Pacific Division of the American Philosophical Association Meetings of 1989.
