Every year it holds an annual conference, and it sponsors branches all over the country which put on programmes of lectures and other activities.

The Classical Association has about 3,500 members. Members receive *The Presidential Address* once a year and a newsletter, *CA News*, twice a year. They may also subscribe at substantially reduced cost to the Classical Association journals *Classical Quarterly*, *Classical Review*, and *Greece & Rome*.
