



#### INTRODUCTION TO THE THEORY OF ANALYTICAL PSYCHOTHERAPY ONE YEAR COURSE

The aim of the course is to provide an introduction to the main theories of analytical psychotherapy including those of Freud, Jung, Klein and more recent writers in Europe and America. The course will therefore offer an educational experience for anyone interested in the processes of analytical psychotherapy.
